Title of Report	Appointments to Committees and Outside Bodies
Decision	

Recommendation: The Authority is recommended to:

- 1. In its capacity as Shareholder, remove Stephen McAuliffe, Chris Dowling and Stephen Whale as Directors of South Downs Commercial Operations Ltd;
- 2. Appoint Stephen McAuliffe as a Trustee of the South Downs National Park Trust;
- 3. Appoint Chris Dowling and Stephen Whale to the Policy and Resources Committee;
- 4. Appoint the Appointments, Management and Standards Committee as set out in section 2 of this report; and,
- 5. Appoint Paul Bevan to the Planning Committee, provided that the committee appointment shall take effect from the date of Paul Bevan's appointment to the Authority by the Secretary of State if later than the date of this decision.

I. Introduction

- 1.1 At its AGM in July 2024 the Authority agreed its annual review of arrangements for discharging its decision-making responsibilities, in particular the delegation of responsibilities, and making of appointments, to Committees. Further to the appointments made at that meeting, this report seeks changes to the appointments to the Planning Committee, Policy and Resources (P&R) Committee, and the Appointments, Management and Standards (AMS) Committee. An additional appointment to the South Downs National Park Trust (the Trust) is proposed.
- 1.2 Also, following the Authority's decision at its meeting in July 2024 to terminate the operating agreement with South Downs Commercial Operations Ltd (The Company) to manage Seven Sisters Country Park (SSCP), the Authority, in its capacity as shareholder, is recommended to remove the Members who currently act as Directors of the Company.
- 1.3 Under Schedule 7 paragraph 13(3) of the Environment Act 1995, the Authority has a duty to secure that the division of local authority appointed Members and Secretary of State appointed Members on any Committee is (as nearly as possible using whole numbers) in the same proportion as required in the case of the Authority itself.

2. Issues for consideration

South Downs Commercial Operations Ltd

2.1 The Authority, at its meeting in July 2024, took the decision to bring the management of SSCP within the Authority and to terminate the operating agreement with the Company. As the management of SSCP was the sole focus of the Company under the approved business plan there is currently no other trading for the Company to undertake and the Company

will fall dormant following the 2024/25 financial year. The operating agreement between the Authority and the Company for the management of SSCP terminated on 9 October 2024 and there is no further business for the Board of Directors to transact. Therefore, the Authority is recommended to remove Stephen McAuliffe, Chris Dowling and Stephen Whale as Directors of the Company so that their time, knowledge and skills can be used elsewhere by the Authority.

2.2 As a dormant company, SDCOL will still be required to have at least one Company Director. This will be an officer of the Authority who will also undertake the relevant administrative functions to satisfy the requirements of Companies House.

South Downs National Park Trust

2.3 The Authority currently has two Members appointed as Trustees of the Trust. The Authority may appoint up to four Members as Trustees of the Trust as long as they do not form more than one third of the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees currently has ten Trustees, eight of whom are not appointed by the Authority. Therefore, it is proposed that the Authority appoint Stephen McAuliffe as third Authority appointed Trustees to the Trust. Stephen will bring a new and useful set of skills to the Board of Trustees, in particular, his skills as an ecologist.

P&R and Planning Committee appointments

- 2.4 With Chris Dowling and Stephen Whale proposed to no longer be serving as Directors of the Company, it is proposed they be appointed to the P&R Committee.
- 2.5 Paul Bevan was elected by East Sussex Parishes to be one of their two elected appointees to the Authority and it is proposed his skills and experience will be best employed on the Planning Committee. Appointments of parish elected Members to the Authority are formally made by the Defra Secretary of State. Unfortunately, due to the general election and post-election prioritisation for a new government, Paul's appointment to the Authority has been delayed. Therefore, it is proposed to appoint Paul to the Planning Committee, subject to his formal appointment to the Authority by the Secretary of State. If the Authority approves this approach, once he is appointed to the Authority, he will be able to take up his appointment to the Planning Committee immediately.

Appointments, Management and Standards Committee

- 2.6 The Authority, at its meeting in December 2023, expanded the membership of the AMS Committee from three to five members in order for the Committee to undertake the recruitment of the Authority's permanent Chief Executive. Now that the recruitment and appointment of the Chief Executive has been completed, it is proposed that the membership revert back to three members.
- 2.7 The proposed membership of the AMS is set out below.

3. Options & cost implications

- 3.1 The Authority could decide not to make the proposed appointments. However, the proposed appointments support previous decisions of the Authority and are in line with the Authority's approach that all Members be appointed to a committee of the Authority and that the Authority also appoint suitably skilled Members as Trustees of the Trust.
- 3.2 The costs associated with the administration of the decision-making structures of the Authority are met from within the Authority's core budget.

4. Next steps

4.1 Officers will take the necessary administrative steps to deliver the new committee memberships and outside body appointments.

6. Risks Associated with the Proposed Decision

- 6.1 Members who have been newly appointed to Committees may be required to undertake training in the role and responsibilities of such Committee.
- 6.2 The Authority is the planning authority for the South Downs National Park, and any new appointees to the Planning Committee must undertake the required level of training before they can take part in the decision-making process.
- 6.3 Where the membership of a committee includes ex officio appointments depending upon the person elected or appointed to the relevant office, it could mean that, at any given time, the membership of that committee may arguably not comply with the requirements of the legislation referred to in paragraph 1.3 (i.e. requiring there to be slightly more Local Authority Members than Secretary of State Members) . At the current time the offices of Chair and Deputy Chair of the Authority are filled by Secretary of State appointed Members. Due to the remit of the AMS Committee, in particular, in performing its role in the management and performance management of the Chief Executive, it is considered important that the Chair and Deputy Chair of the Authority are always members of the AMS Committee.
