Title to Report **Enforcement Update**

Purpose of Report To update SDNPA Members on planning enforcement

workload statistics including notices served

Recommendation: To note the update on enforcement action

I. Overview

- 1.1 The SDNPA planning enforcement team investigates alleged breaches of planning control within the recovered areas of the National Park: Adur & Worthing, Arun, Brighton & Hove, Eastbourne, Mid-Sussex, & Wealden. In addition, the Authority now deals with breaches of Planning control within the area of Horsham within the Park (as from I October 2024) The team also investigate any alleged breaches where the SDNPA "called-in" any original planning application post October 2017 or any other investigations that we wish to "call-in", plus any breaches relating to Minerals & Waste for the entirety of the Park. We also monitor the host authorities' response to investigating enforcement for the non-recovered areas (Chichester, East Hampshire, Lewes, & Winchester).
- 1.2 The purpose of this report is to highlight the work the SDNPA Planning Enforcement Team. The team is comprised of: DM Lead (Jean Chambers) currently off sick with her role covered by temporary Senior Enforcement Officer (Rob Campbell), Enforcement Officers (Alan Hiron & Emma Goodwin), and a recent addition to the team, Monitoring & Compliance Officer (Sam Whitehouse). The yearly figures in the table below run from the start of April each year.
- 1.3 It has been over a year since we last reported these matters to the Committee. These figures in the table below were taken on 20 October 2024.
- 1.4 Alan and Emma have now been with the Authority for two years in their current roles. In the past two years they have closed 244 enforcement complaints. I 19 (48%) were found not to be breaches of Planning. 31 of the remaining 125 (25%) resulted in compliance by removing the breach. 35 of the remaining 125 (28%) resulted in the breaches being resolved by the successful submission of Planning Applications, bringing in associated planning fees.
- 1.5 In the last two years they have served five Enforcement Notices, and have three cases under legal consideration for prosecution; one for a TPO offence, the other two for non-compliance with an enforcement notice. One Article 4 Direction has been served.
- 1.6 The cases received and cases closed figures for the whole Authority are shown in Section 3.
